


ALDWICK PARISH COUNCIL NEWSLETTER - NOVEMBER





Little things make a big difference to our local ecosystem. Even a tiny garden pond attracts wildlife, while a patch of garden allowed to grow wild or a bird feeder judiciously placed all help enrich our natural environment. Lay off the chemicals for best results! At Aldwick Parish Council our tree group is busy replanting trees and identifying those that have been felled, but not yet replaced. At district level, Arun District Council is striving to protect natural habitats, such as our coastline. They're also

working to develop their tree planting strategy to enhance woodland habitats. Arun are continuing to increase areas of long grass (by 5% each year) and wildflower meadows to ensure that our areas are as diverse as possible. Leaving these areas longer provides food and homes for smaller mammals, birds and insects. Working together, we can make the Aldwick ecosystem something to be proud of.
