You don't need a licence to hold a street party that is solely attended by local residents. You may need a temporary road closure in which case you should get in touch with Highways at West Sussex County Council at least 6 weeks in advance. Insurance is not required for street parties and nor is a food licence. However,

you must ensure that any food provided is fit to eat.
