Do you know who's living next door to you? It could be a local hero like John Gordon Lockwood who lived in Aldwick Felds until his death in April this year. John served in the Royal Navy during the war and, despite being colour blind, was drafted into Signals. He served on the HMS Malaya, where he received extensive burns to his body and arms after a torpedo explosion. He subsequently served on the HMS Kingsmill and was present in June 1944 at the D-Day Landings on Gold Beach. Having survived the trials of war, John

and his wife Marjorie raised a family in Harrow, before retiring to Aldwick Felds where they lived for over thirty years. John was a local hero and there are surely others out there. If you know of an Aldwick resident who should be celebrated, why not let us know? Please note that only residents whose credentials can be fully confirmed will be considered.
