## Trees need help!



Hasn't the spring blossom been a lovely sight this year? It's been an extremely dry spring with very low rainfall in recent months. Each year we participate in the County Council's tree planting scheme and although they maintain those new trees for 3 years, resourcing this in the current dry period is proving challenging and we need your help please! If there's a young tree in a verge near your home, it would marvellous if you are able to

help keep it watered ideally they need around 50L a week but even a bucket or watering can full once a week or more could make a difference to its survival – thank you!

A not-for-profit charity, they provide West Sussex County Council's meals on wheels service, delivering hot, nutritionally balanced meals across West Sussex, 365 days a year. vegetarian, kosher, Asian, halal, gluten-free, and sugar-reduced options. Meals are delivered hot by DBS-checked Community Team Members between 11am and 2pm. There are no contracts, allowing for flexible ordering. A safe and wellbeing check is also carried out on every delivery. **Only rain down the drain!** Arun District Council, West Sussex County Council, Southern Water and the Environment Agency have launched a Yellow Fish campaign, highlighting what can happen when fat, oils or other waste is poured down drains or road gullies. Whatever you put down the drains ends up in our sea, rivers and streams.
