What did the Parish Council ever do for us?

If you don't know us, you may sometimes wonder what a Parish Council is for. Below is a list – but not at all an exhaustive one – of the things our hard-working Councillors, who work on an entirely voluntary basis, did in the past year:

- ✤ Funded Play Ranger session in the half term and summer holidays at Avisford and West Park.
- ♦ Co-opted three new Councillors who have all been working hard on your behalf.
- ♦ Ran a questionnaire on drug litter in the area.
- ♦ Installed a brand new website which has been receiving plenty of 'hits' from our residents.
- ♦ Facilitated coffee mornings and meetings of local residents and local interest groups.
- Distributed grants worth six and a half thousand pounds to 17 local groups who serve our residents in many diverse ways.
- ♦ Erected two Silent Soldiers in Millennium Gardens and West Park
- ♦ Answered numerous diverse queries from residents
- ♦ Held our annual Electors' meeting at which you were able to highlight your wishes and concerns
- ♦ Hosted a very special Remembrance Service to mark the centenary of Armistice Day.
- ✤ Highlighted consultations, services and other items of interest on our website and in our monthly Parish newsletter in Sussex Views
- ♦ Held Planning, Amenities, Finance and Council meetings and presented your views to the District and County Council.
- ✤ Funded 20% of an upgrade to the Avisford Park playground.
- ☆ Acquired Operation Watrshed funding for the repair of the drainage pipe running under Aldwick Road, leading to the duck-pond.
